GRANTS FROM A PRIVATE OR CORPORATE FOUNDATIONS

Foundations rarely make grants directly to individuals because of the increased burden of detailed record keeping and related IRS requirements.

Even most scholarship funds are given to academic institutions, which in turn cover the fees involved. Funding organizations usually make grant awards and other contributions only to IRS-designated exempt, 501(C)(3) organizations generally known as "charitable, scientific, and/or educational" organizations.
